



Procedure for export of RNR produce via Phuentsholing

1. All RNR produce (Apple, Orange, Vegetables, Cardamom and Ginger) that are permitted for export need to follow prescribed containment protocols.
2. The three main modes of export are as follows:
 - **Through FCBL:**
 - The FCBL exports all types of vegetables. Individuals wishing to export these vegetables through FCBL may contact Mr. Dorji Tashi, Director, FCBL at 17115060 for confirmation and clarifications. The goods should be delivered at the identified aggregation centre/collection points at source, from where FCBL will collect and transport to Auction Yard in Phuentsholing. FCBL will facilitate transshipment of goods at Auction Yard including entry of Indian vehicle up to auction yard.
 - **Through BEA:**
 - The Bhutan Exporters Association (BEA) exports apple, citrus, ginger and cardamom. Individuals wishing to export these commodities through BEA may contact Mr. Tshering Yeshe, general Secretary, BEA at 17160790 for confirmation or they may directly contact the following exporters. The BEA will facilitate transshipment of goods at Mini Dry Port (MDP) including escort of Bhutanese vehicles entering MDP.

 - **On their own:**
 - Individuals may also export any of the commodities themselves if they have the market links and associated resources; with the support of the Department of Agricultural Marketing and Cooperatives (DAMC) and BEA. Such individuals must submit the details of Indian vehicles entering MDP to pick up consignments and Bhutanese vehicles entering MDP to reach the consignments, one day before the transshipment date, to RSTA (unwangmo@rsta.gov.bt) or to RTIO (yeshiwangchuk@moea.gov.bt) in the prescribed format which can be downloaded from website <http://www.agrimarket.gov.bt>.

In general, for transportation within the country, all vehicles and people movement, if it entails inter-dzongkhag movement, should register one day before the travel date with Royal Bhutan Police at www.cpms.rbp.gov.bt along with details including vehicle number, vehicle type, date of journey, destination, license number and passenger details among others.
